MINUTES OF MONTHLY PUBLIC MEETING FOR THE TUSAYAN FIRE DISTRICT BOARD OF DIRECTORS

A PUBLIC MEETING OF THE TUSAYAN FIRE DISTRICT GOVERNING BOARD WAS CONVENED ON SEPTEMBER 15, 2022 AT THE TUSAYAN FIRE STATION AND, VIA ZOOM CONFERENCE CALL, TUSAYAN AZ 86023.

CALL TO PUBLIC/CONFIRMATION OF QUORUM

Meeting was called to order at 10:02 a.m. The following members of the Tusayan Fire District were present in person were Board Chair John Vail, Board Member Marty Harris, Board Member Andrew Aldaz, and Board Member Helena Villanueva. Others in attendance were Fire Chief Greg Brush and Business Administrator Kate Johnson. A quorum was confirmed.

Discussion/Approval of August 11, 2022 and August 17, 2022 Regularly Scheduled Board Meeting

Motion to approve regularly scheduled August 11, 2022 and August 17, 2022 Meeting Minutes. First by Vail and seconded by Board Member Harris. Motion carries, 4-0 in favor. Board Member Shearer was not present.

Financial Report

Business Administrator Johnson presented the Financial Report verbally and in written form. (See form for details). Johnson informed the Board that as of August 31, 2022, there is \$66,771.30 in the holdings operating account. In the reserved restricted account, there is \$49,971.42. Liquid assets in total are \$116,741.72. There are no checks to sign since they got signed yesterday. FDAT Revenue is \$563.69. Rental station income remains the same each month between Guardian and AmeriGas at \$2,060. Johnson points out that however, District billing fees have increased to \$1,850.79. Johnson also states that there has been no change to the Wildland fire income. Johnson concludes report. Vail asks if anyone has questions to which Aldaz raises one. Aldaz asks about the trailers in Valle, mentions that since TFD is getting revenue from them, are the firefighters using the units. He noticed the siding is starting to come off and suggests that TFD invests in trailer maintenance before winter. Johnson agrees that there should be an investment towards it, however, TFD has more than used up the entirety budget item for housing maintenance with getting a new hot water heater for one of the units that went out. Vail asks if the sighting needs to be replaced or repaired, Aldaz says it needs to be replaced. Vail will look at it next week. First by Vail and seconded by Board Member Harris. Motion carries, 4-0 in favor. Board Member Shearer was not present.

Fire Chiefs Update

Chief Brush presented report verbally and in written form. (See form for details.) Brush stated that TFD is at 187 calls for year to date. Gave kudos to those who helped with the 12th COVID vaccine event. 654

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vaccinations have been provided through TFD with an outside agency since April 20, 2021. Brush congratulated D'Albini for the AFG grant he applied for and was awarded for outfitting the ambulance that was awarded to TFD. Brush mentions that the gas tester is glitching and it will need to be taken to get serviced. Greg Lawrence used older technology to get it calibrated. Ongoing interviews for firefighter EMT and Paramedic. There are more applicants this round thanks to Johnson's advertisement. The breaks, starter, and tank have been down but fortunately repaired thanks to D'Albini. The rear engine would not start and the engine is also out of service. Tony will be there with parts. Brush thanks Miguel, Louie, John, and Bob for installation of TFD furnaces, generator, and A/C. Hydrant checker is exuberantly priced, and had to get 2 parts replaced for it. There was a mass casualty incident drill at the airport. D'Albini wanted to do a desktop drill. Had 30-40 volunteers and it was successful. Vail mentioned wanting to contact the local newspaper. Brush mentions that Molly offers CPR classes and a final test. There is also a new roof leak in the laundry room. It has leaked into the light fixtures. Asked Louie to look into it. TFD has lost 3 light bulbs because of it. Brush praises Johnson for working hard on the Mega Wildland Grant. The Rotary Club is doing a second round of potential money of \$500, Brush compliments Greg and Lawrence for putting an email request for it. Brush wants the money for a 14ft ladder. Dispatch has a new coordinator director, Laurie Tuddle. Brush tried meeting up with her and Laurie is supposed to come to TFD. Brush concludes updates.

Old Business

Discussion, Update, and Possible Action Regarding Possible Subscriptions for Out-of-District Properties

Board Chair Vail reported that he and Brush met with Jay Christiansen, Bob, and Jay. Jay and Vail had a conversation that they provide them with paperwork that proves they have coverage. Vail is waiting on approval from Mark on the paperwork. Has copies so that other members can view it as well. Aldaz asks if it gets approved by the attorney, will it be put into policy? Johnson states that yes but there needs to be a Board Motion to fully adopt that policy. Aldaz asks that if we go and approve this, and the next person does not to the Firewise, who is going to check on that? Vail responds that it is done at a yearly basis.

Discussion, Update, and Possible Action Regarding Community Evacuation Plan

Chief Brush presented a checklist of items to include in during an evacuation. Brush stated he presented at the Tusayan Community Meeting. Praises Aldaz for spreading awareness to join the meeting but Brush says that he has not been able to reach all businesses just yet. The town will put it in their agenda, the council, and anyone who is looking online. TFD has an upcoming blood drive on October 22, 2022. Greg Lawrence is gearing up another firefighter volunteer academy. It starts on October 14, 2022. The Board agrees that the community evacuation plan is something they want to keep on informing everyone in town about.

Discussion, Update, and Possible Action Regarding Grant Opportunity through Coconino County Community Wildland Protection Plan

Business Administrator Johnson reports that it is an extreme amount of work, is doing the best she can to get done by the deadline. She has had all the appropriate coordination and collaboration meetings with the pertinent partners, is still working on scheduling more with the smaller property owners. Johnson also has a meeting today at 11am with the grant writer over the phone to discuss the status of the grant and where she is and what she has. The submission deadline is October 6, 2022.

Johnson's goal is to get at least one grant submission done to update the next CWPP. Brush, Vail and Harris all praise Johnson for her hard work. They also ask her how her meeting went yesterday, Johnson states that the meeting went excellent. The town is going to offer a letter of support towards the grant that says they are in alignment with TFD's objectives and the CWPP's implementation of all three categories that are: planning risk reduction, fuel's mitigation, and public outreach. Johnson also had a meeting with ADOT who will also give TFD a letter of support. Vail adds that Forest Service has been great as well with providing maps. Johnson raises a concern about TFD's current Wildland Protection Plan that was updated in 2013. The only version that TFD has with any ink signatures was signed in March 2013 by the Mayor of Tusayan at the time. There are no other ink signatures from the Fire Chief, Forest Service, District Ranger, and other entities required on that document. Johnson states that there might be a chance that the document might be considered invalid because of the lack of approval signatures to show that it was in fact updated. Therefore, the only thing TFD would be eligible to submit would be the second grant proposal which is to update the next CWPP.

New Business

Discussion and Possible Action and Approval of Installation of Budgeted Station Air Conditioning

Vail states that the door is closed because it is currently being repaired. Johnson states that she accidentally forgot to remove this part. Vail thanks Louie and his crew for the help.

Discussion and Possible Action and Approval of AFG Grant Funds Through Opening and Award of Sealed Bids

Vail reports that TFD was awarded a grant to stock the new medic unit that is a \$128,000 grant. The sealed bids policy states that anything over \$25,000 needs to be put out to bid. Johnson got everything squared away to the newspaper. TFD got published twice in the Phoenix newspaper. Vail opens up the grant package and Members go over it discussing the details of the monetary expenses, monitor, and gurney. Aldaz states that TFD needs to decide if the bids are comparable, if the bids are put together, then TFD should be able to make an easy decision. Vail states that the lowest bid is the direction he wants to go. Harris and Helena also agree. First by Vail and seconded by Board Member Harris. Motion carries, 4-0 in favor. Board Member Shearer was not present

Discussion and Possible Action and Approval of the Fiber Installation

Brush reports that it is \$15,000 collectively for two connections. One for Guardian and a separate one for TFD. The current plan is the fiber goes across the telephone poles and under the asphalt for CPR and TFD. John Champaign said that it will be \$50 per foot for the asphalt. 20ft in total. TFD would need permission from Guardian. Brush states that Champaign has been on site. Champaign showed up and took measurements. Brush brings up his concerns about TRIAD. Harris states he does not have TRIAD. Brush believes TFD can get by with TRIAD but doesn't think companies are not working as well. Board Members state how it has recently been a problem along with Verizon. Brush will remain in contact with the necessary contacts.

Board Member Reports

Vail reported that this Prop 310 sent an email and would like for everyone to get the word out about. One cent for every \$10 an individual spends will be sent to rural Fire Districts in the state so TFD could really benefit. Vail also praises everyone involved to get the HVAC (?) going. Board Member Harris brings up why TFD Board Members are not Fire Marshalls. Chief Brush states that TFD simply does not have that. Aldaz brings up that the individual(s) who did all the permits, they are the ones responsible for who becomes or is a Fire Marshall. Vail states that the town used to be the Fire Marshalls representative. The Town should be consulted about this. Board Member Aldaz reports that on September 22, 2022 there will be a community gathering. Aldaz wants the fire department to have their own table and talk about what Molly is doing and anything else TFD wants to promote. No other Board Members had reports.

Adjourn – Motion to adjourn at 11:20 a.m. First by Board Chair Vail and seconded by Board Member Villanueva. Motion carries 4-0. Board Member Shearer was not present.

AZ's 144 fire districts can't keep up on calls without a state tax

When the worst happens and you dial 911 in search of emergency help, you need firefighters and paramedics to reach you as quickly as possible — because every minute matters. If you live or travel outside of larger cities like Phoenix or Tucson, emergency response times routinely take 30 minutes or more.

Why such prolonged waits for help? It's because Arizona's 144 fire districts are in serious crisis, battling a shortage of people, equipment and resources our state needs to address to keep residents and visitors safe.

Fortunately, you can help solve this public safety crisis on Election Day, by voting yes on Proposition 310 to protect Arizona families.

Referred to the ballot by a bipartisan coalition of legislative lawmakers, Proposition 310 seeks to speed up 911 response times by creating a temporary one-tenth-of-a-penny state sales tax mandated to go to fire districts.

This new dedicated revenue — about \$150 million a year — will provide a huge boost to Arizona fire districts, which have long been funded by property taxes capped in ways that have left these districts struggling.

Chief among the beneficiaries will be smaller districts like Tusayan, where residents help bear the cost of emergency services for 6 million visitors to the Grand Canyon each year, and the Hellsgate Fire District near Payson, which has seen layoffs decimate its staffing and response times over the past few years.

Of course, you don't have to be among the 1.5 million Arizona residents who live in a fire district to depend on district firefighters for help and protection.

Fire districts, often located along major highways and interstates, typically serve as first responders to vehicle crashes across the state — at a time when those crashes have soared, according to newly released statistics from the Federal Highway Administration.

Last year, more than 1,200 people died on Arizona roads, the highest number of fatalities since 2006. And rural roadways, where fire districts are often the only help available, are especially deadly: Over the last five years more than 2,000 travelers have died in Arizona's rural areas, while another 30,000 have been injured.

Besides assisting drivers and passengers headed everywhere from Las Vegas to San Diego, Mexico to the Grand Canyon, fire districts also serve as the first line of defense against the wildfires

that sweep the state every spring and summer. Those fires have claimed more than 2.2 million acres in our state over that same five-year period.

These crisis numbers will only continue to rise as Arizona adds population and as tourism rebounds after the pandemic. Proposition 310 provides a mechanism to fairly fund fire districts, and to ensure that smaller districts get the most help by capping funding available to larger districts.

To put the financial side of the equation into perspective, Prop 310 will cost you a penny the next time you spend \$10 to buy lunch. If you spend \$100 on dinner for four, it will cost you a dime.

Groceries, gasoline and prescription, most of which aren't subject to Arizona state sales tax, will remain exempt from the measure.

Your yes vote on Proposition 310 will

tangibly improve public safety all across Arizona with minimal impact to household budgets. And it will provide fire districts — largely ignored by the federal government when it came to pandemic relief funding — with a way to cope with the surging fuel costs, higher equipment costs and higher insurance costs brought on by inflation. Most importantly, your "yes" vote will likely help save lives and property everywhere there's a fire district in our state.

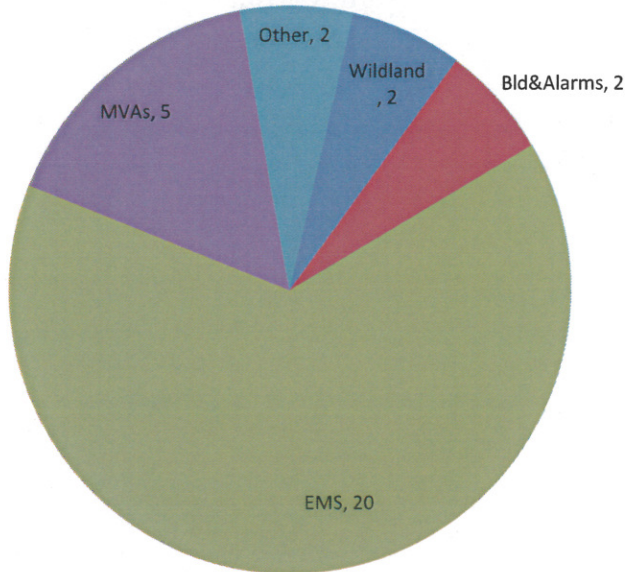

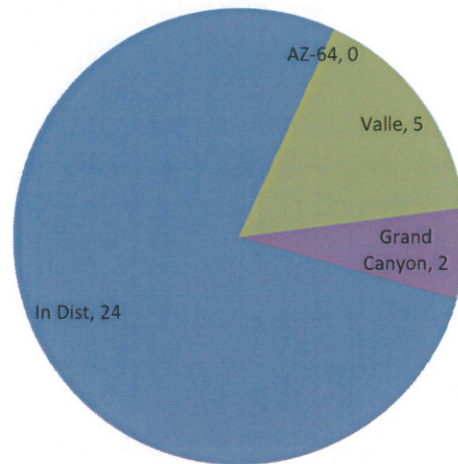

- **Fire District Funding Proposition 310:** For the November 8th election, Arizona Proposition 310 will be on the ballot. Proposition 310 would enact a 0.1% sales tax for 20 years- January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2042- and deposit revenue from the tax into a Fire District Safety Fund. [On a \$10 purchase, Prop 310 would cost a penny]
- A "Yes" will have the effect of establishing a Fire District Safety Fund, increasing the Transaction Privilege (Sales) Use Tax by one tenth of one percent, from 2023-2042 to pay for the fund.
- A "No" will have the effect of retaining existing law on tax rates and funding for fire districts.
